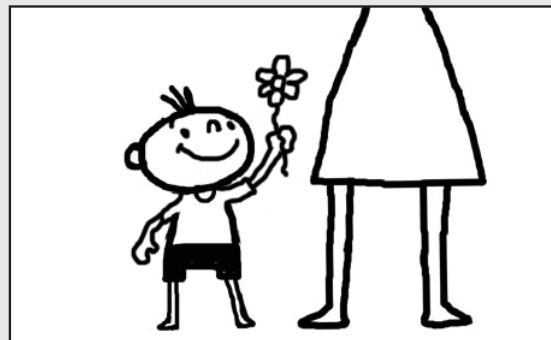
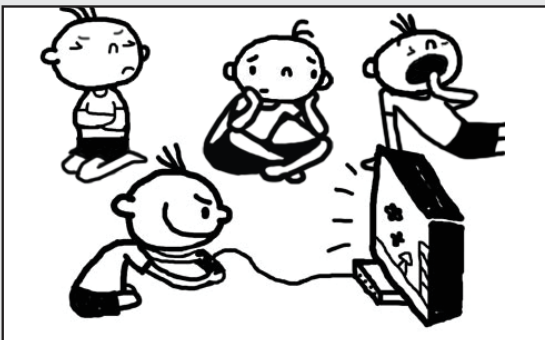
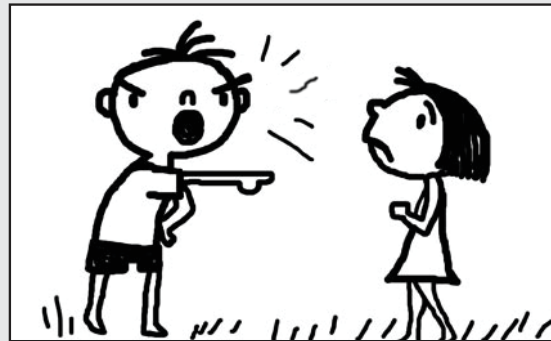
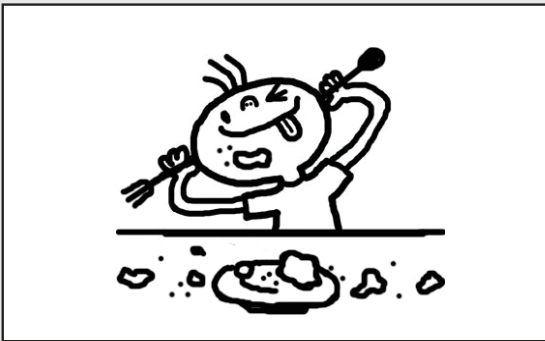
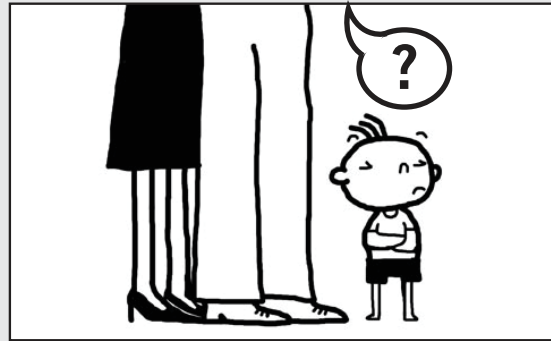
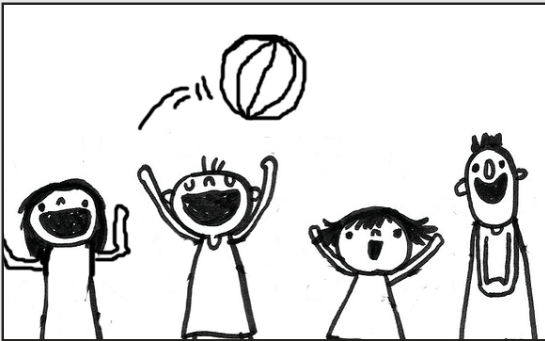
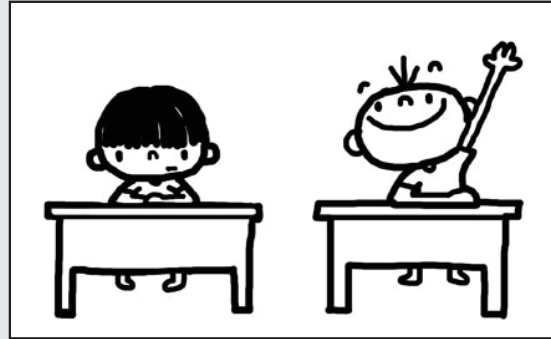
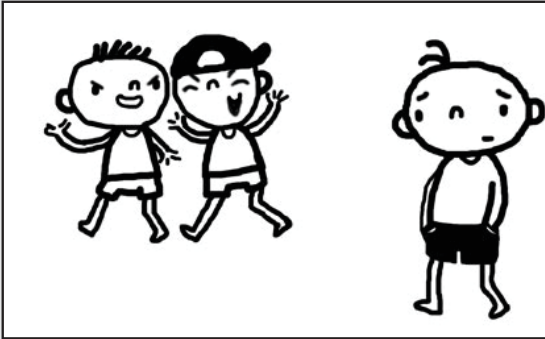
People who's good actions (thawab) are more than their bad, are rewarded by going to heaven or paradise. This is a place like a beautiful garden where they can exist in happiness.

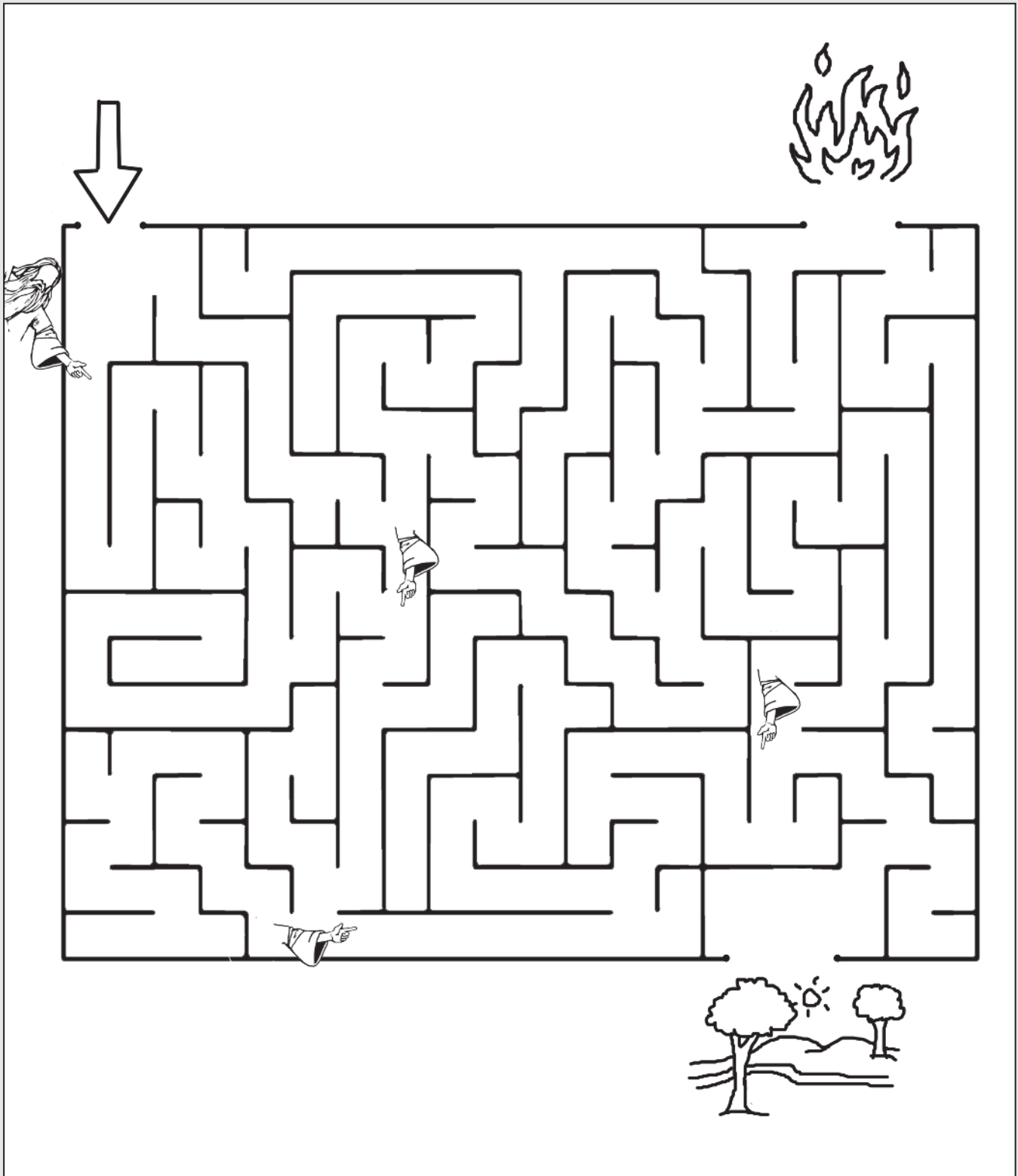
Allah swt sent down 124,000 Prophets.

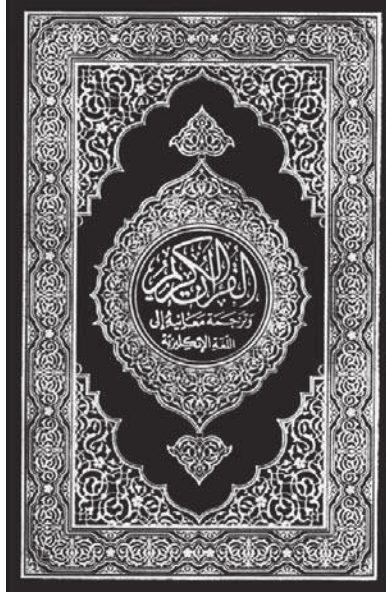

The Quran is for Muslims to follow. The Quran tells us true stories of the prophets Allah swt sent down as well as about heaven and hell and how to act and do things in the right way.

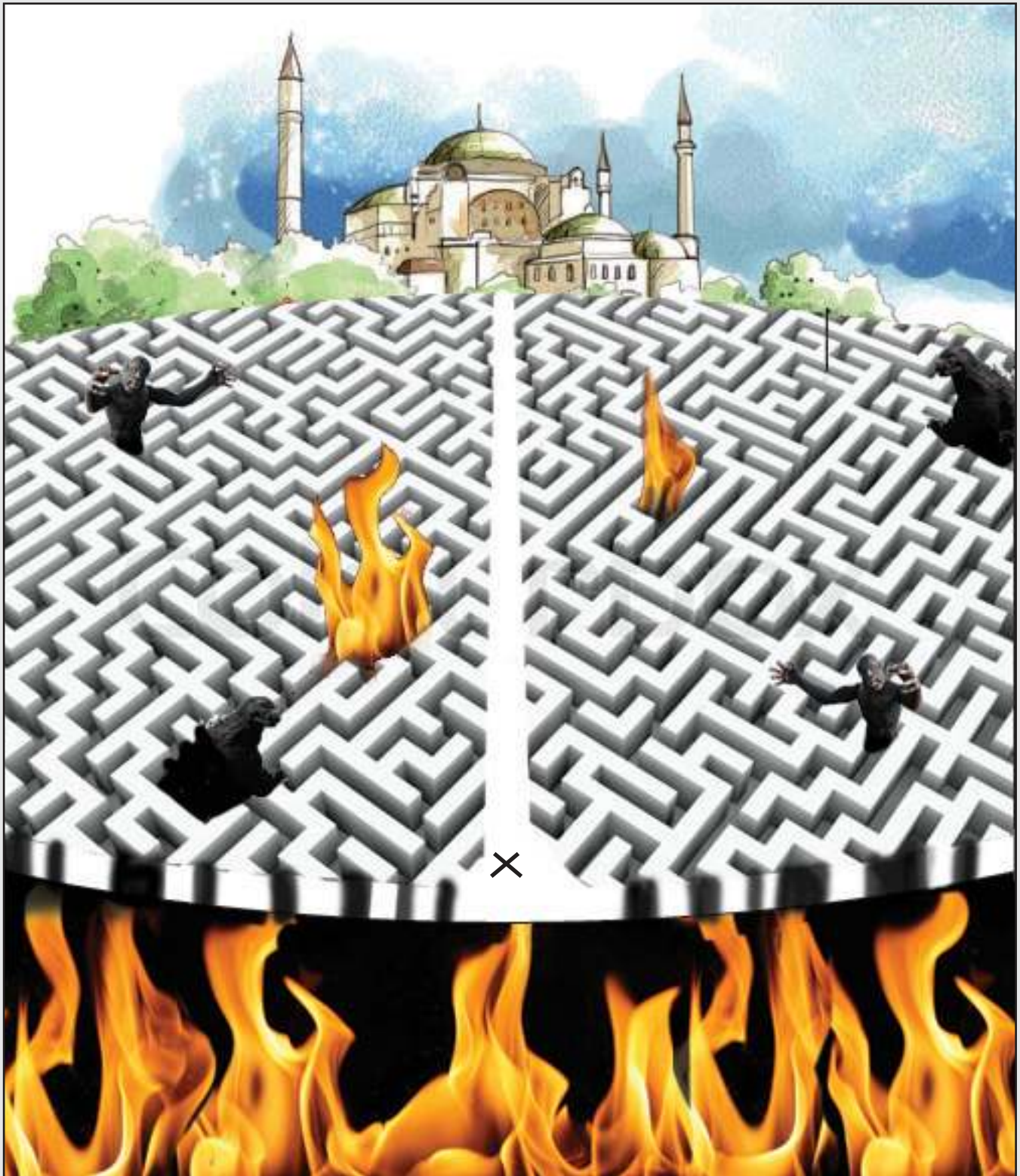
It is written in Arabic. This is one of the reasons we study Arabic language, So we can read, understand and appreciate the miracle of the Quran.

The Imams

There are 12 Imams that came after the prophet.

The first Imam is Imam Ali (as). He is the cousin of Prophet Muhammed. He married Prophet Muhammed's daughter Fatima tul Zahra (as). Their children then grew up to be the second and third Imams: Imam Hassan and Imam Hussain (as).

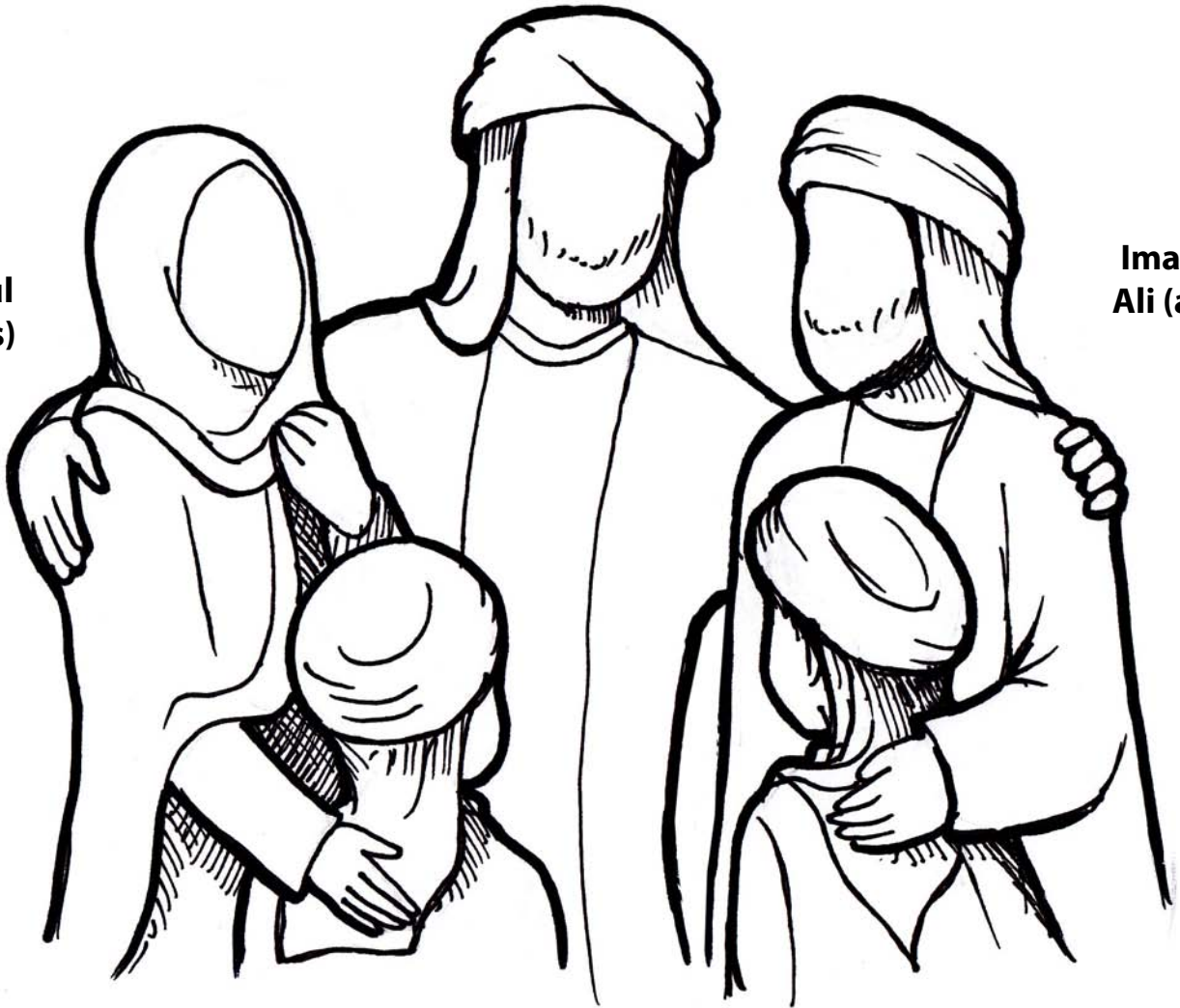

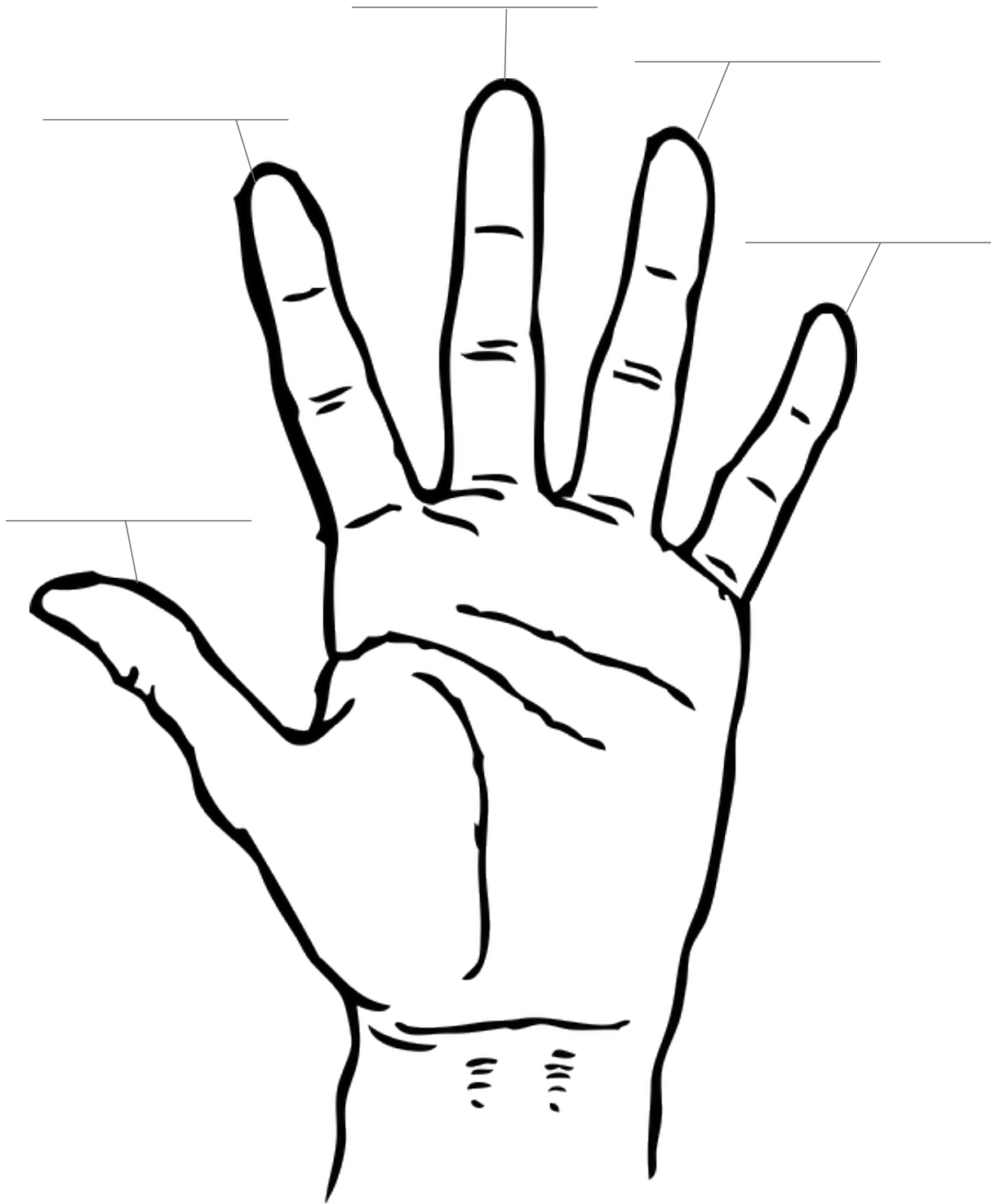

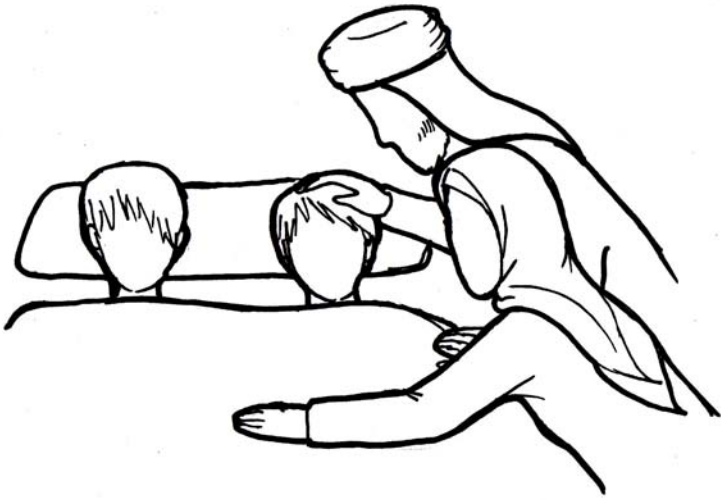

The Nidhr of Fasting



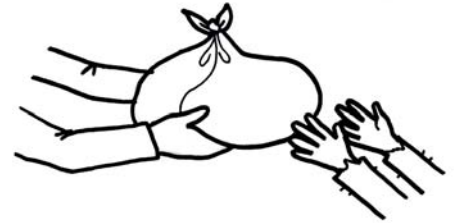
Once Imam Hassan (as) and Imam Hussain (as) were sick when they were kids. Their mother and father; Fatima al-Zahra (sa) and Imam Ali (as) made a Nidhr to fast three days on the recovery of their children, in thanks to Allah (SWT).



When the children became better, the whole family fasted these 3 days.



As they were about to eat their food, on the first day of fasting, a poor man knocked at their door asking for some food. The family gave all the food they had, which was a few loaves of bread.



On the second day, when the family sat down to eat at iftar an orphan knocked on their door again asking for something to eat. They gave him all their food.



On the third day, when the family sat down to eat, a prisoner of war knocked on their door asking for food. They gave him all their food too.

The next day, Rasulallah (saw) came to the family with these verses of the Noble Qur'an:

"And they give food out of love for Him to the poor and the orphan and the captive.

We only feed you for Allah's sake, we desire from you neither reward nor thanks. surely we fear from our Lord a stern, distressful day.

Allah will guard them from the evil of that day and cause them to meet with ease and happiness."

(Noble Qur'an, 76:5-12)

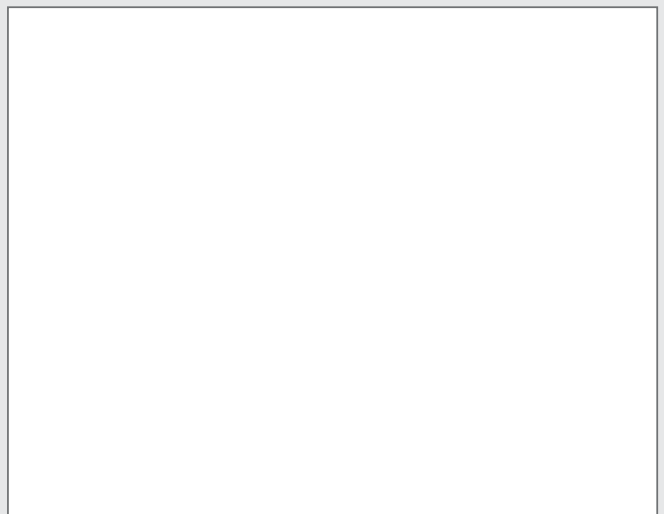
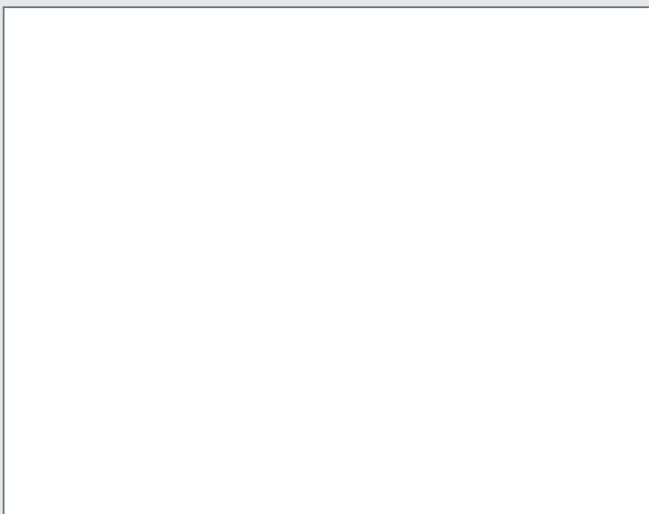
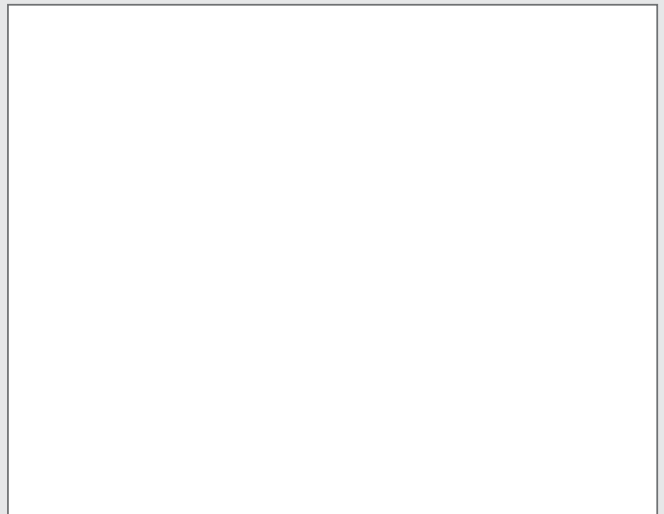
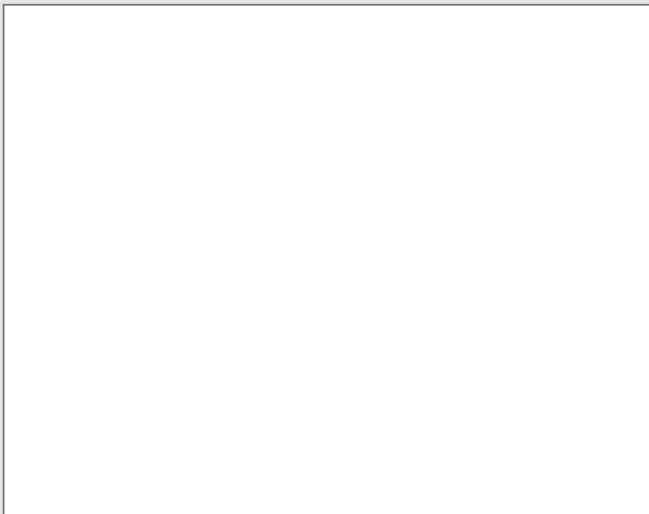
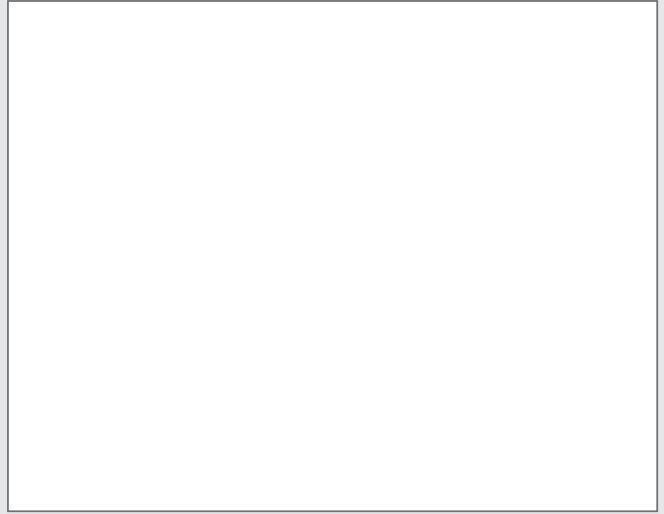
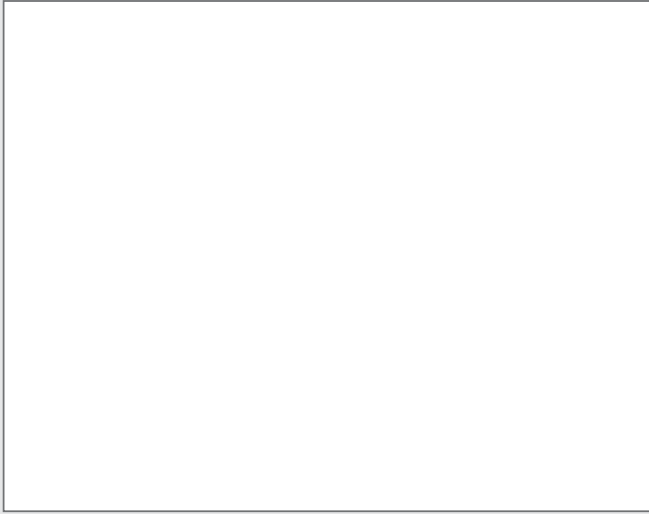


The Moral of the Story:

- The harder it is to give to others, the better the reward.

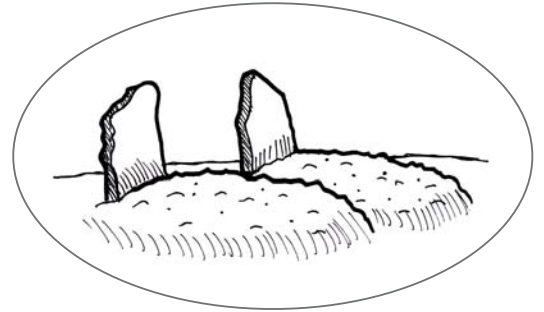

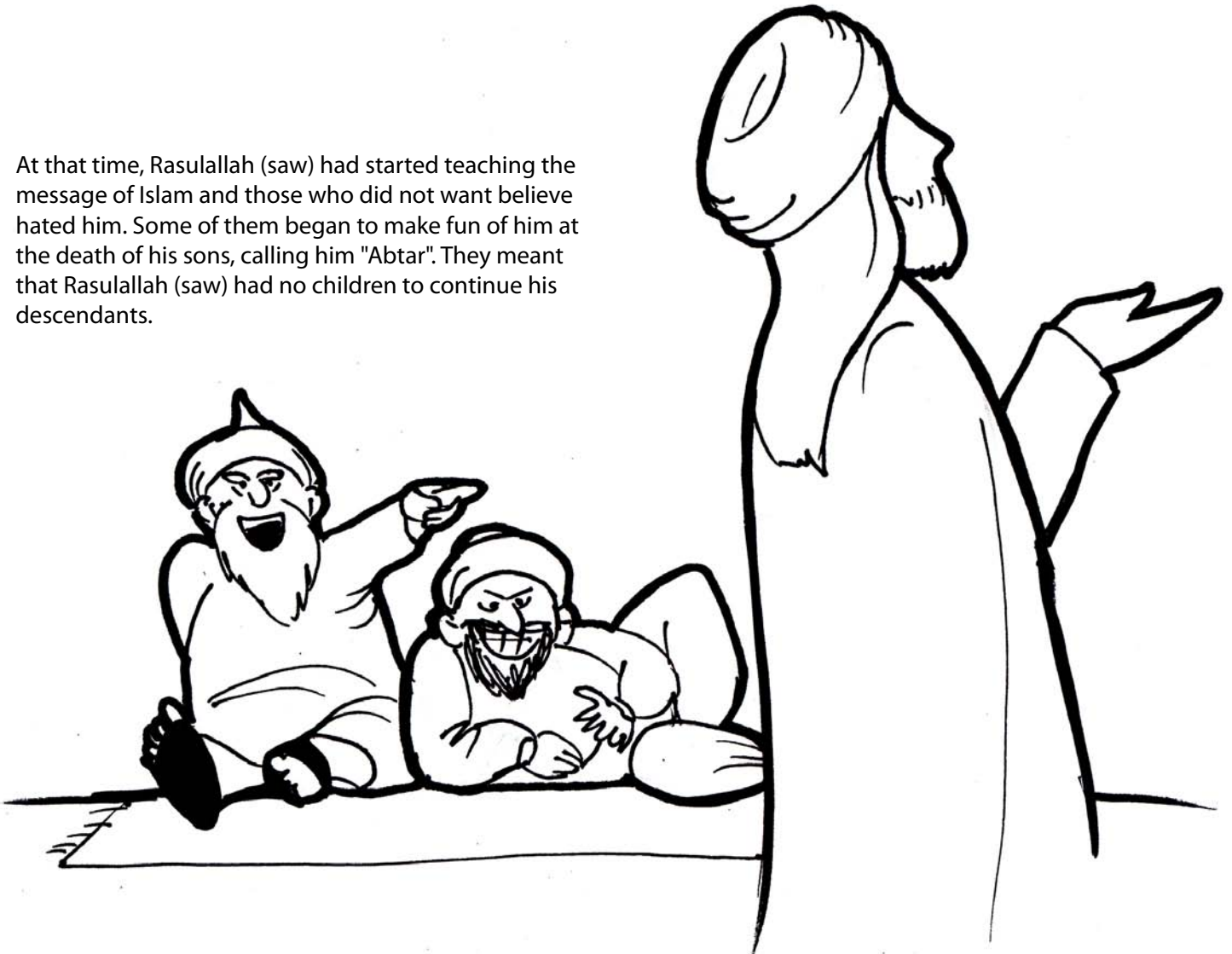
Surat Al Kawthar

Fatima al-Zahra (sa) was born to Khadija tul Kubra (sa) and Rasulallah (saw).



Before her birth, Rasulallah (saw) had had two sons, Qasim and Tahir, but both boys had died when they were babies.

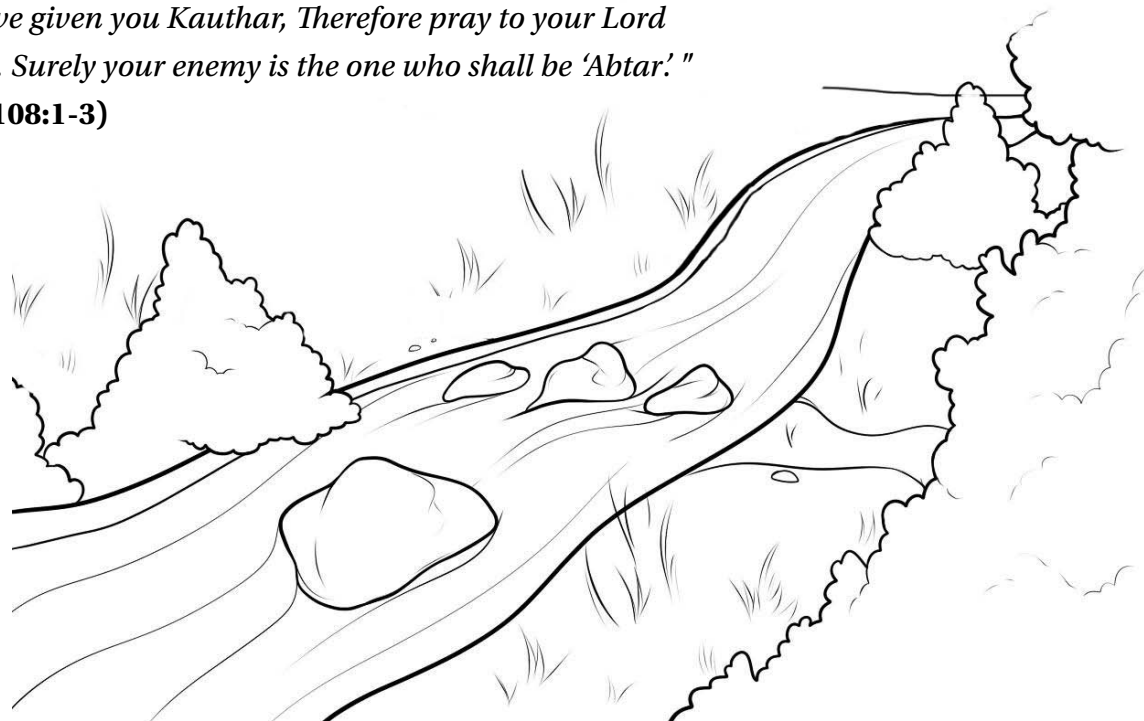
At that time, Rasulallah (saw) had started teaching the message of Islam and those who did not want believe hated him. Some of them began to make fun of him at the death of his sons, calling him "Abtar". They meant that Rasulallah (saw) had no children to continue his descendants.



When Fatima al-Zahra (sa) was born, the following chapter (Surah) of Noble Qur'an was revealed:

"In the Name of Allah, the most Kind, the most Merciful. Surely (O Muhammad) We have given you Kauthar, Therefore pray to your Lord and make a sacrifice. Surely your enemy is the one who shall be 'Abtar.' "

Surah al-Kauthar, (108:1-3)



"Kawthar" means:

- A stream in heaven. Imam Ali will give water from it to the believers.
- Also means abundance, and the birth of Fatima al-Zahra (as) signified that, through her, The Prophet's descendants would be in abundance.





We can see that the promise of Allah (SWT) is certainly true because today, there are many thousands of descendants of (Sayyid) Rasulallah (saw) in the world, while there is nobody who claims to be a descendant of the Quraish (the people who made fun him). Thus the enemies of Rasulallah (saw) were those who became truly "Abtar".

The Moral of the Story:

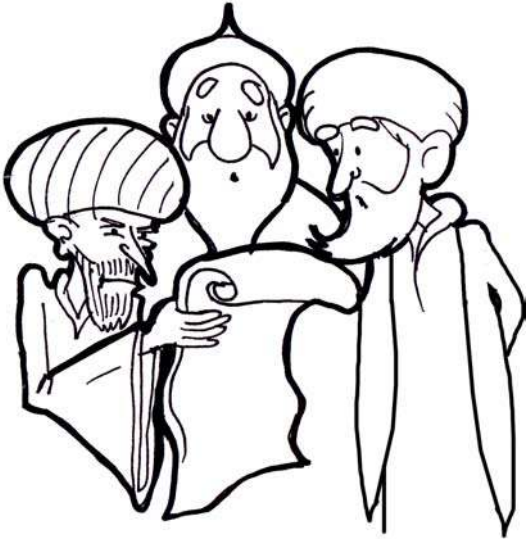

Al Mubahala - The Cursing



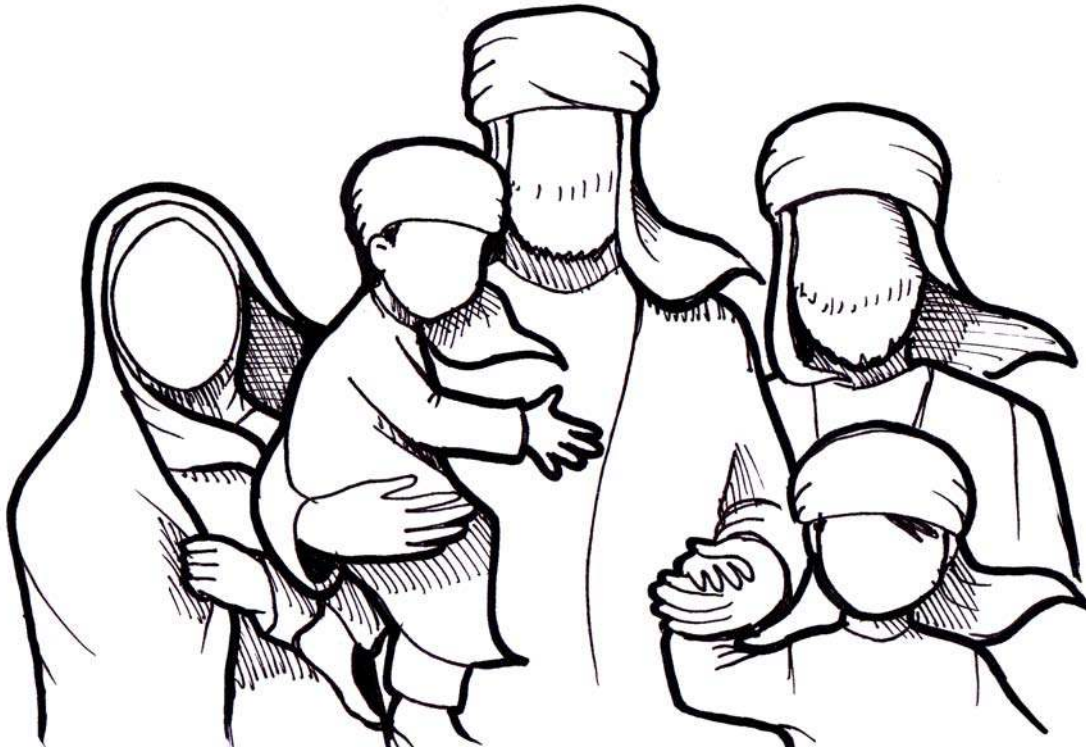
The Holy Prophet (S.A.W) sent a letter, inviting the Christians of Najran (a city in the province of Yemen) to embrace Islam. In response to that letter the Christians sent representatives including their highest spiritual leader.



When they arrived they asked, "What is your opinion about Jesus Christ?"

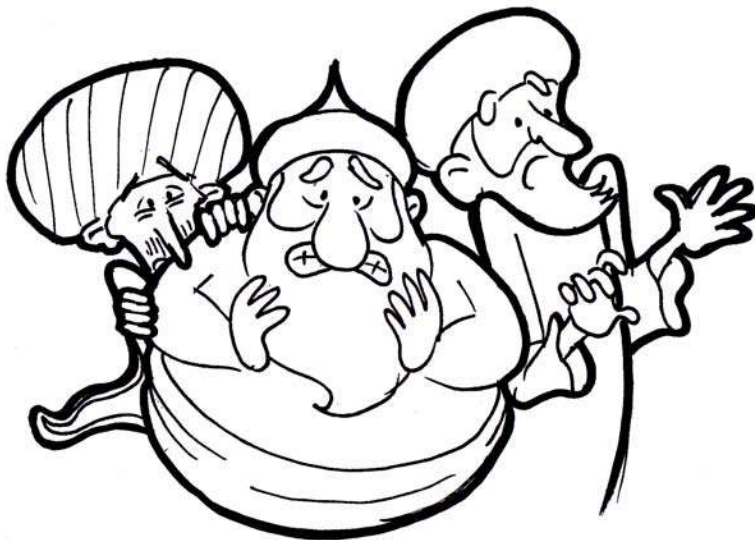
The Prophet explained with verses of the Quran, that Christ was a Prophet like Adam and like Adam, he was created from dust and was not the son of God. After this, the Holy Prophet invited them to embrace Islam. The Christians refused to be convinced by anything.

Consequently, after an ayat came down on him, the Holy Prophet declared the challenge of 'Mubahala' or 'to curse on each other'. The challenge would be that the Muslims and Christians would meet and curse and pray to Allah against each other. The group who is successful would win, proving that their religion is true. The Christians accepted the challenge.

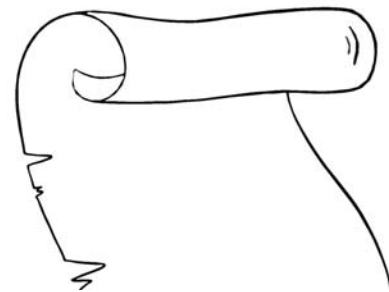


On the morning of 24th Zilhajj that the Holy Prophet emerged at the appointed time and place, from his home with Imam Hussain in his arms and holding Imam Hasan's hand and Sayida Fatimatul Zahra followed by Imam Ali. Many people hoped to be picked by the

Prophet to do the curse with him, but the Prophet brought only Muslims who are most religious, prestigious and pure, his Ahlul Bayt, and no one else. The Christians came out in great quantity to confront the Prophet, but what they saw was something they did not expect.



The Christian leaders became frightened of the Prophet's confidence in the outcome of the incident and advised their followers to pull out of the Mubahala stating that, "By God! He would not have come with his family if he was afraid that the proof would be against him".




The Christians stepped down from doing 'Mubahala' against the Prophet, and a peace treaty was signed.

The Moral of the Story:

The event of the Mubahala shows the importance of Ahlul Bayt. The prophet did not choose any other people for this task, showing the high level of the members of Ahlul Bayt.

THE YEAR OF THE ELEPHANT

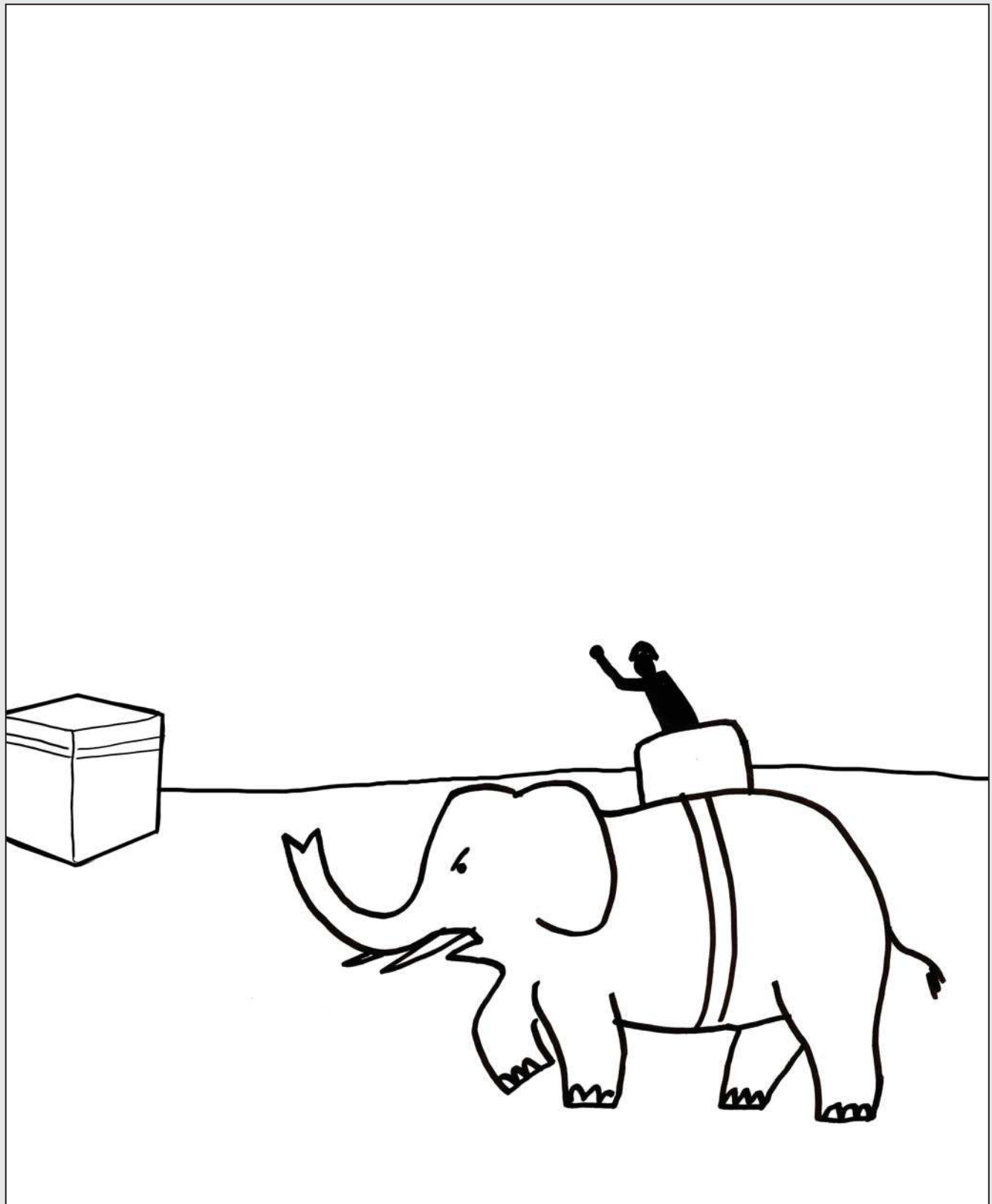

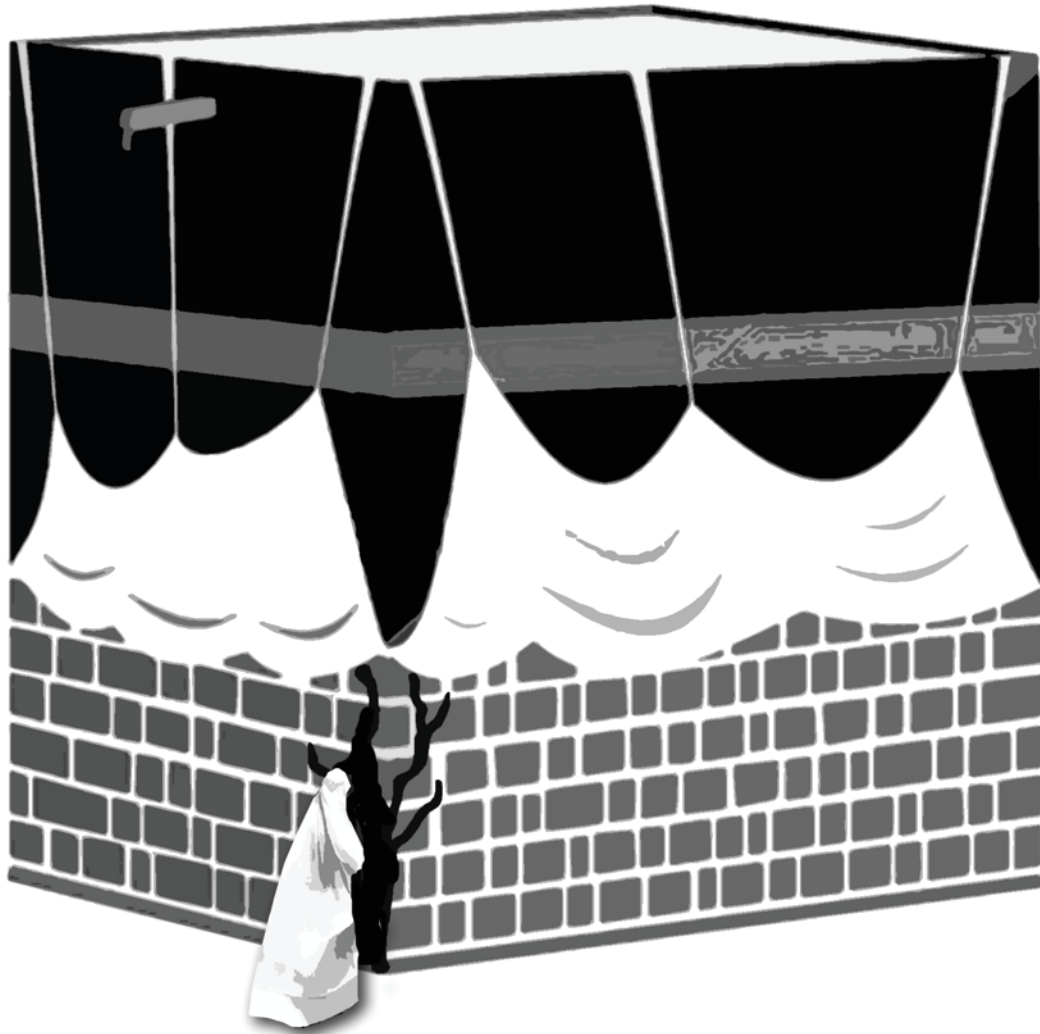

THE BIRTH OF IMAM ALI (AS)

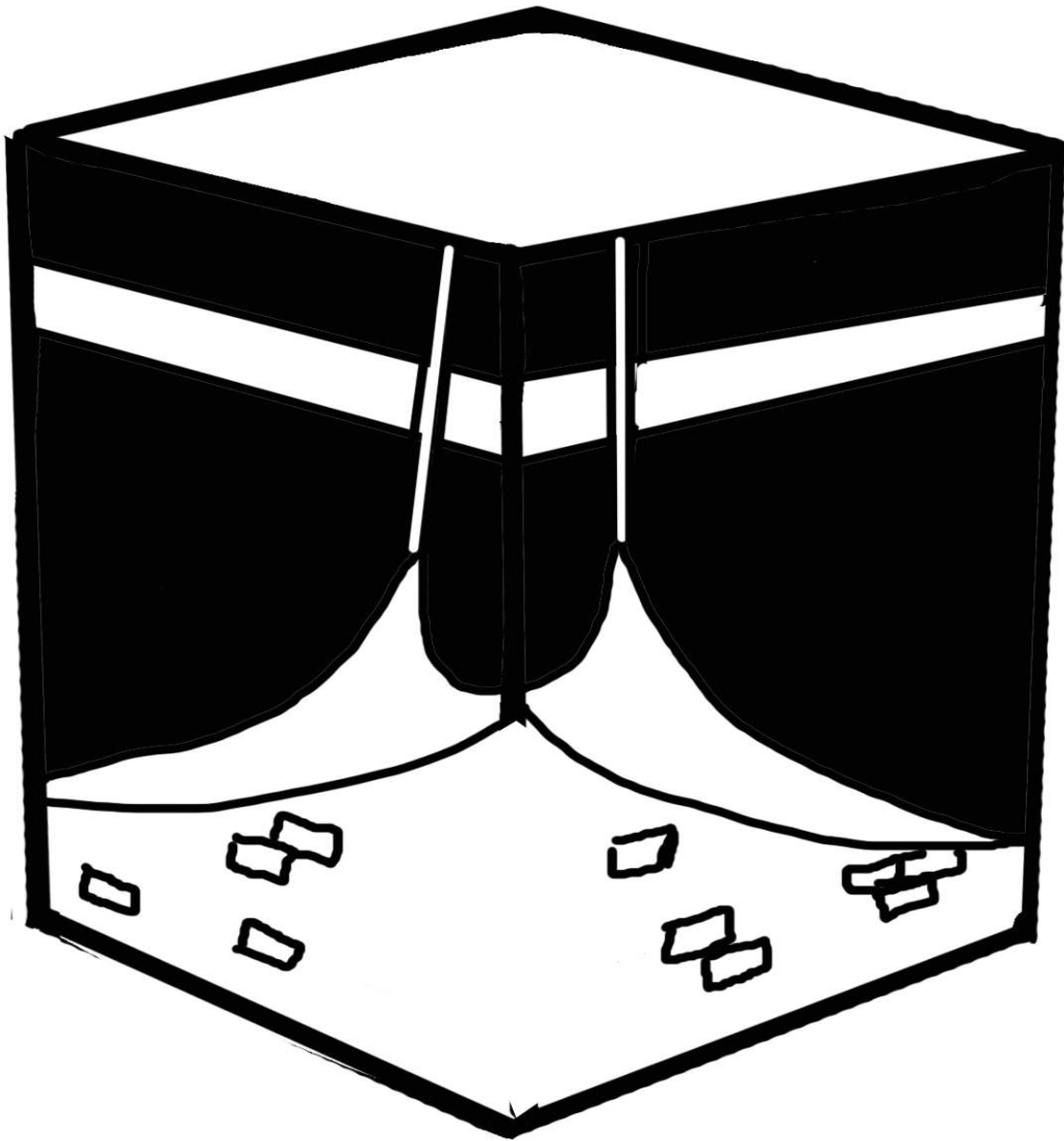

After praying to Allah (SWT) for help and safety in delivery, the walls of the Kaaba opened and she went inside to give birth to Imam Ali (AS). The crack closed behind her and she remained inside until 3 days later Prophet Mohammed (SAW) opened the door to the Kaaba and the mother and child walked out. You can still see the crack in the side of the Kaaba today. The birth of Imam Ali (AS) shows us that he is special because no other prophet or Imam was born in holy building before.

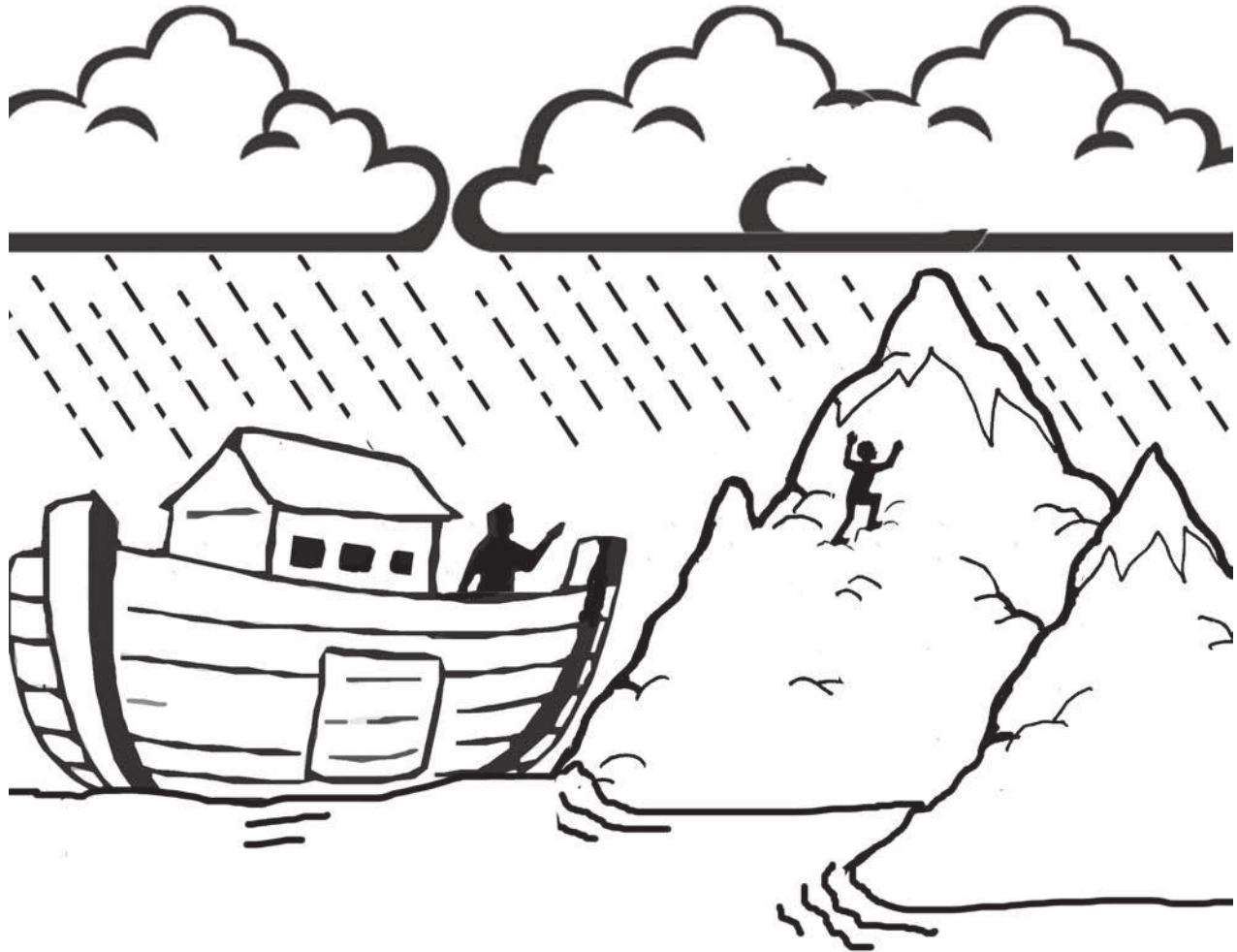

PROPHET NUH (A.S)

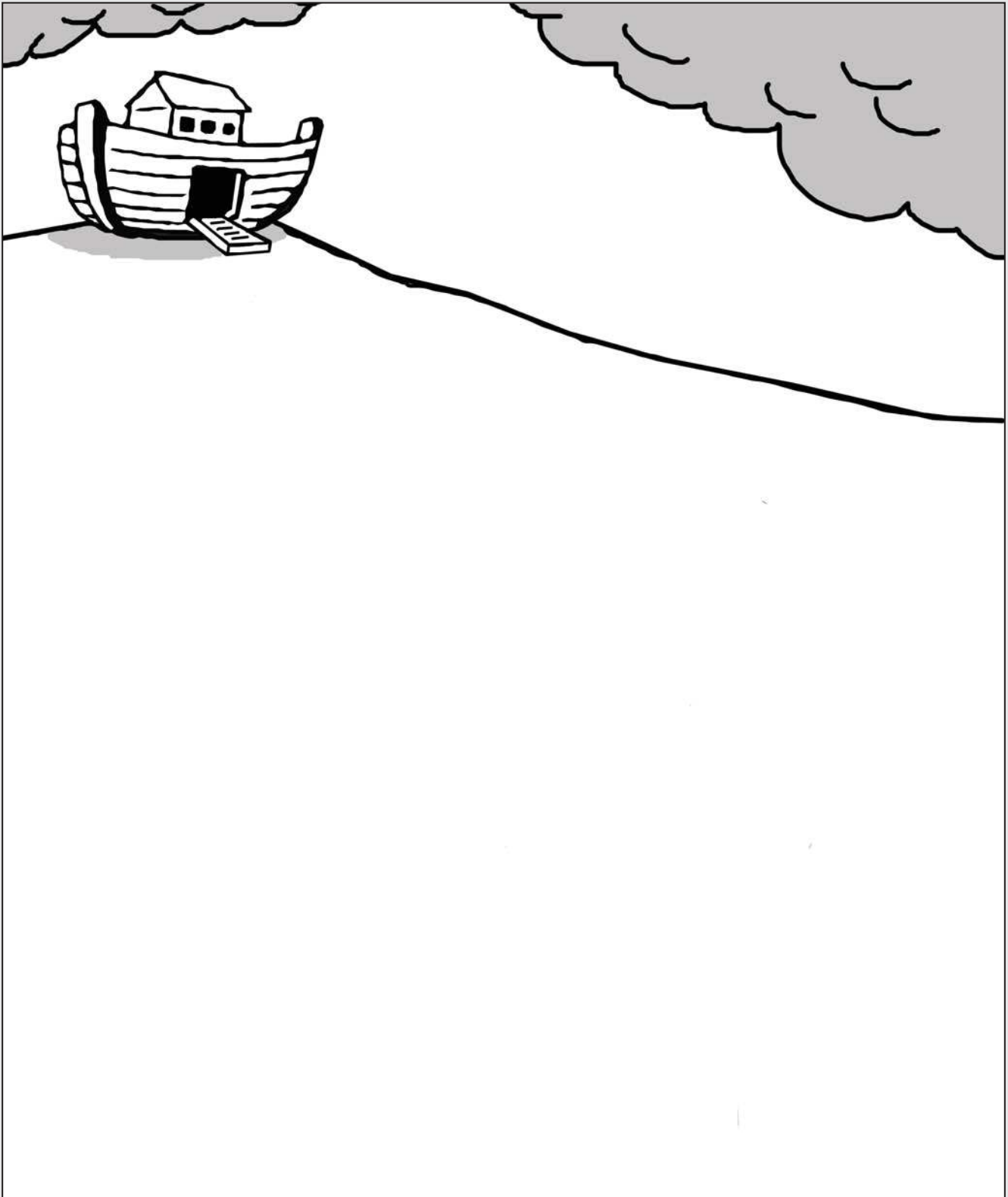


Prophet Nuh (A.S) warned his people to pray to Allah (SWT), but they did not believe in him except for a very few. One of Nuh (AS)'s sons and his wife also did not believe in him. One day Allah SWT told Prophet Nuh (AS) that he will punish those who did not believe, and ordered him to build a huge boat that could carry him, the believers and two of each animal. It took a long time for Prophet Nuh (AS) to build his boat, and all the disbelievers laughed at him. When the boat was finished and all the animals and the believers were in the boat, it started to rain. It rained so much that the whole earth flooded and all people who did not believe in Allah (SWT) drowned. Nuh's son climbed a mountain to escape the flood, Nuh told him to get on the boat, but the boy refused and said he would be safe on the mountain. Noah's son eventually drowned.

Prophet Isa (AS) was born to Sayida Maryam (AS) without a father. He spoke as soon as he was born. When he grew up Prophet Isa was able to cure the sick, and bring the dead to life. These miracles of Allah (swt) were to convince the people of the time to believe in him.

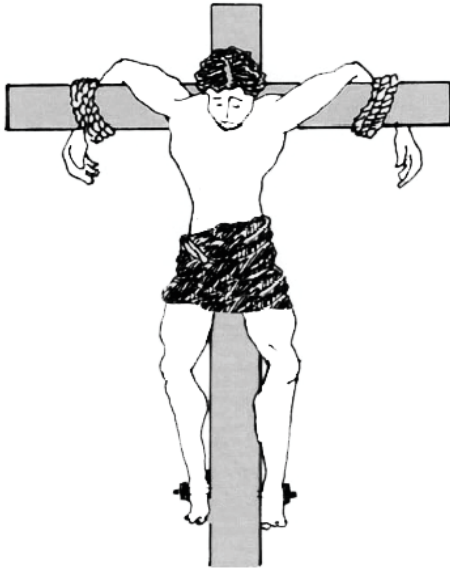
When Prophet Isa was 30 years old, he got the order of Allah (SWT) to start his mission and the Holy Book, Injil, was revealed to him. He told it to 12 people of his followers so that they could travel and teach others.

The disbelievers wanted to kill Prophet Isa (AS). They gave, Yahuda, one of his followers, 30 pieces of silver to tell them which house Prophet Isa (AS) was in. They wanted to nail him to a cross and kill him. At this time, Allah raised Prophet Isa (AS) to the heavens. In the meantime, Yahuda went to the Prophet's house but found it empty. Allah (SWT) changed Yahuda's face to look like Prophet Isa's, so when he came out of the house to tell the enemies that the house was empty, they grabbed him and took him away thinking he was Prophet Isa (AS). Although he told them that he wasn't, they wouldn't believe him and he was crucified instead.

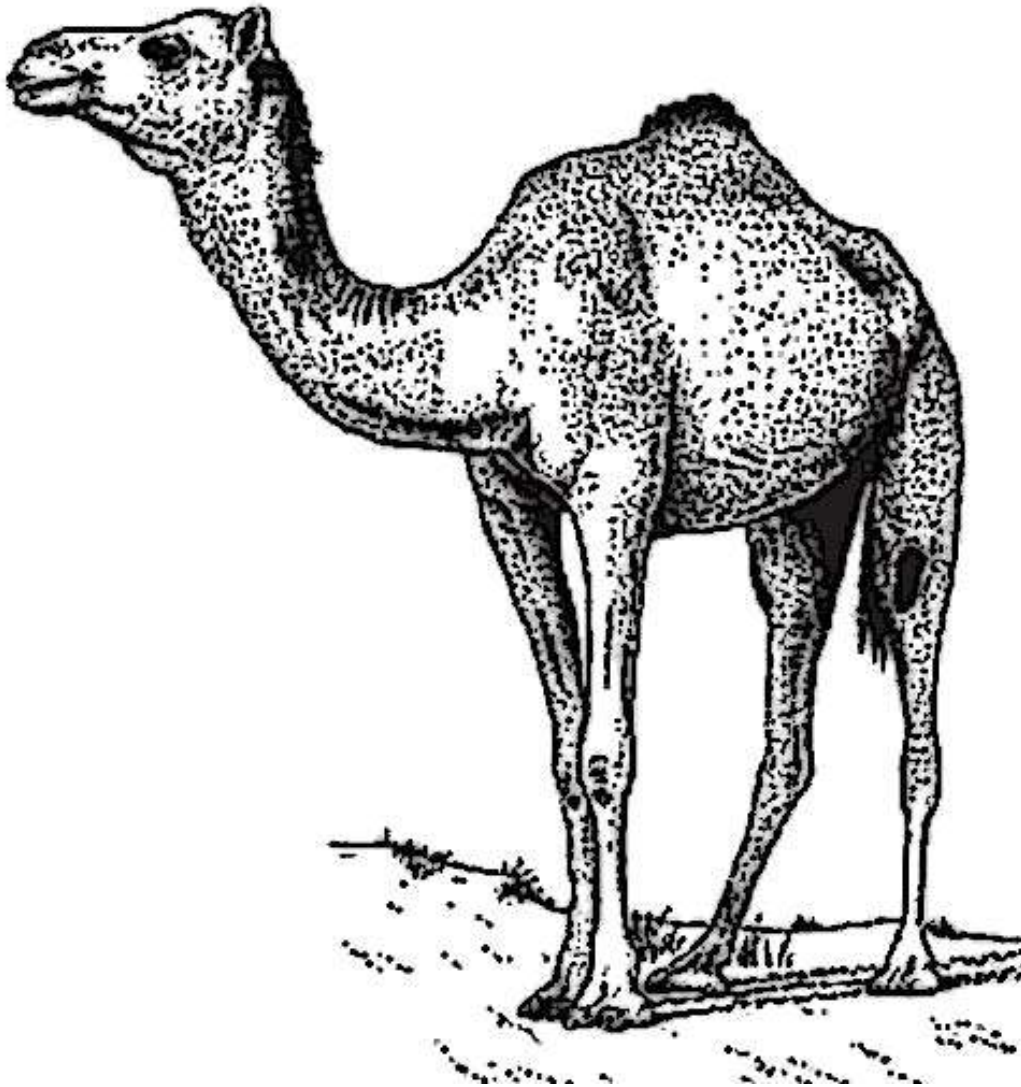

PROPHET SALIH (A.S)

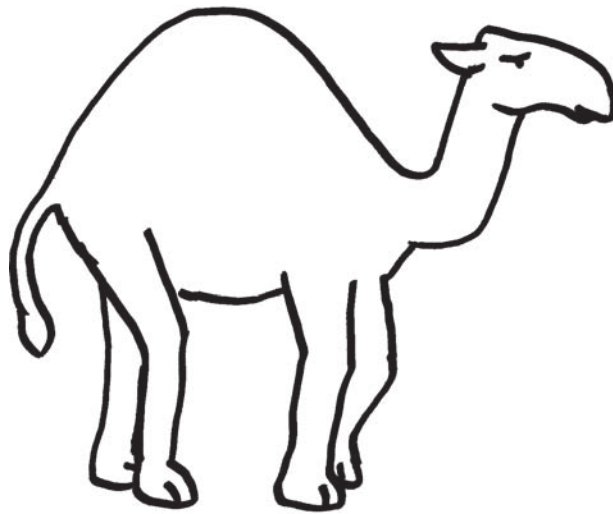

PROPHET IBRAHIM (AS)



Prophet Ibrahim's (A.S) people used to pray to idols. To show them how useless idols were, he broke them all with a large hammer, and then placed the hammer in the largest idol's hand. When his people saw the broken idols they asked who did this, he replied: "the idol who carries the hammer." They said he can't break things, he's made of stone. Prophet Ibrahim (AS) asked: "So why do you pray to idols if they cannot even protect themselves?"

This angered his people. As punishment they made a huge fire and threw him in it. Allah (SWT) made the fire cold and made it a beautiful garden in the center. Prophet Ibrahim (AS) did not burn and walked calmly out of the fire shocking his people, and showing them the miracle of Allah (SWT).

PROPHET AYUB (A.S)



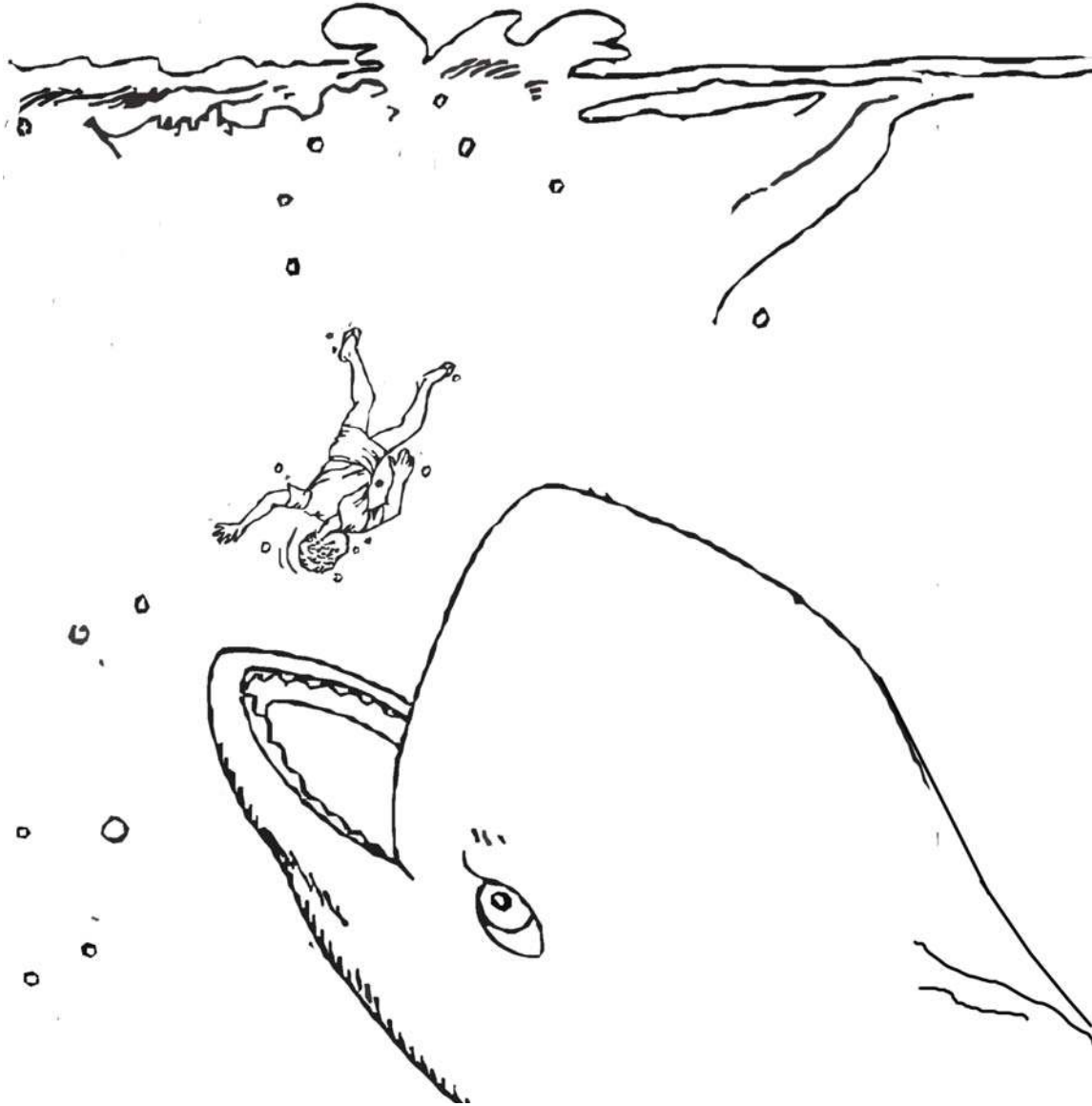

PROPHET YUNUS (A.S)

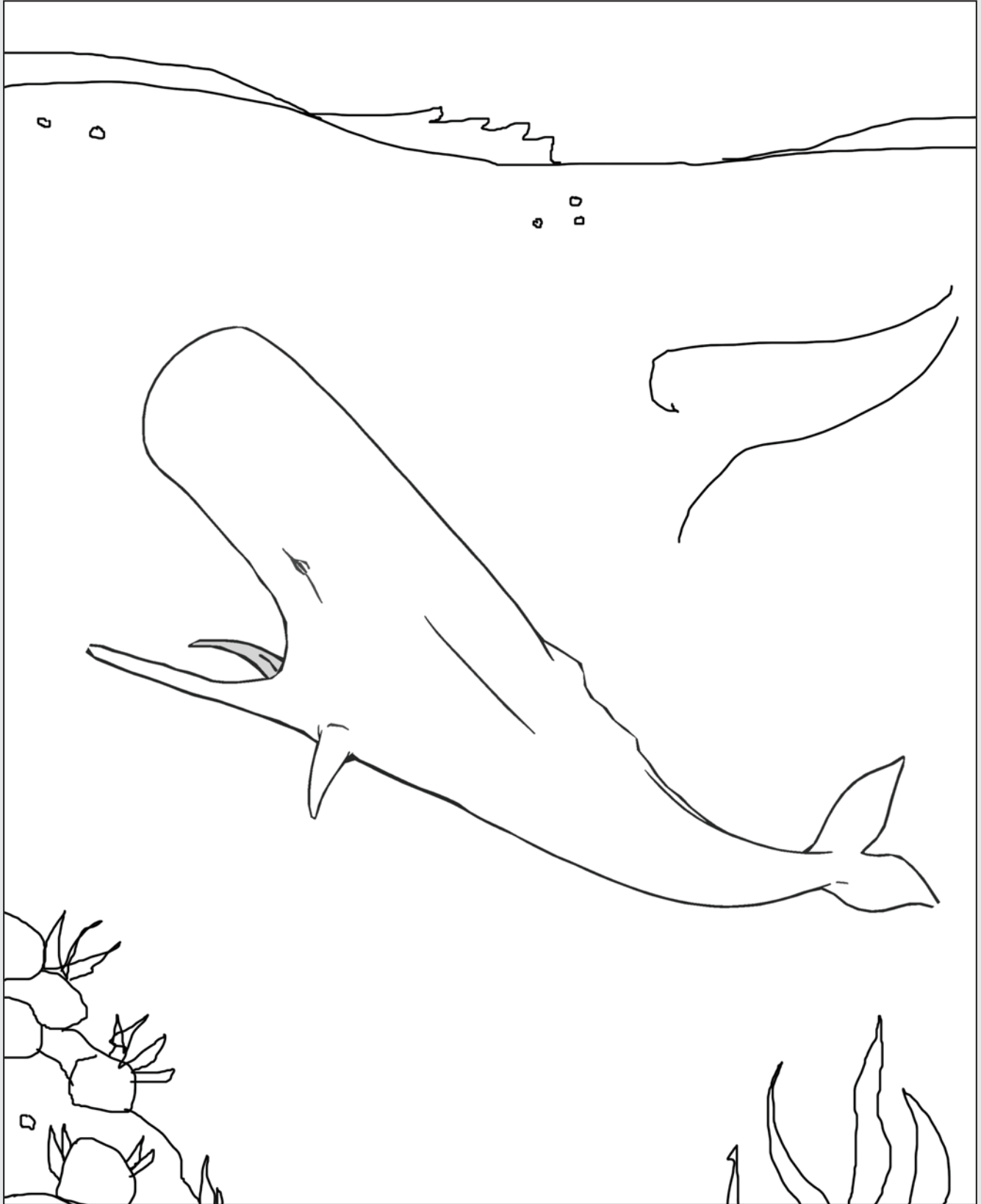

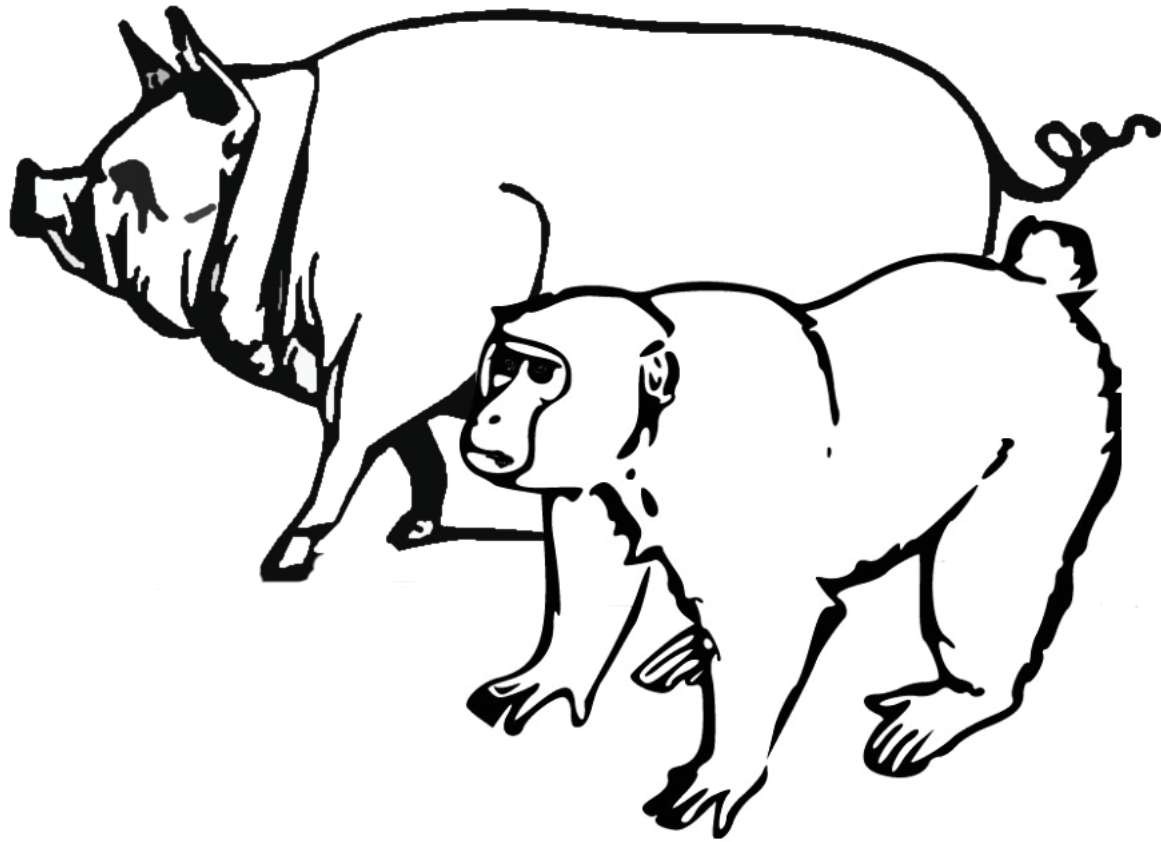

THE PEOPLE OF SATURDAY



He then heard a voice, the voice of Allah (swt). Allah (swt) gave Prophet Musa (as) two special miracles, a stick that changed into a snake, and his hand that turns very white. Prophet Musa went to Pharaoh, the king of Egypt, a man who was very bad and called himself God. He showed him these miracles to prove the existence of Allah (swt). Pharaoh brought his magicians, and told them to do the same. They made ropes move, but when Prophet Musa (as) put down his stick, it ate up the magician's ropes. The magicians saw the truth and said: "We believe in the God of Musa." They continued to believe even when Pharaoh tortured them and eventually killed them.

PROPHET SULEIMAN (AS)

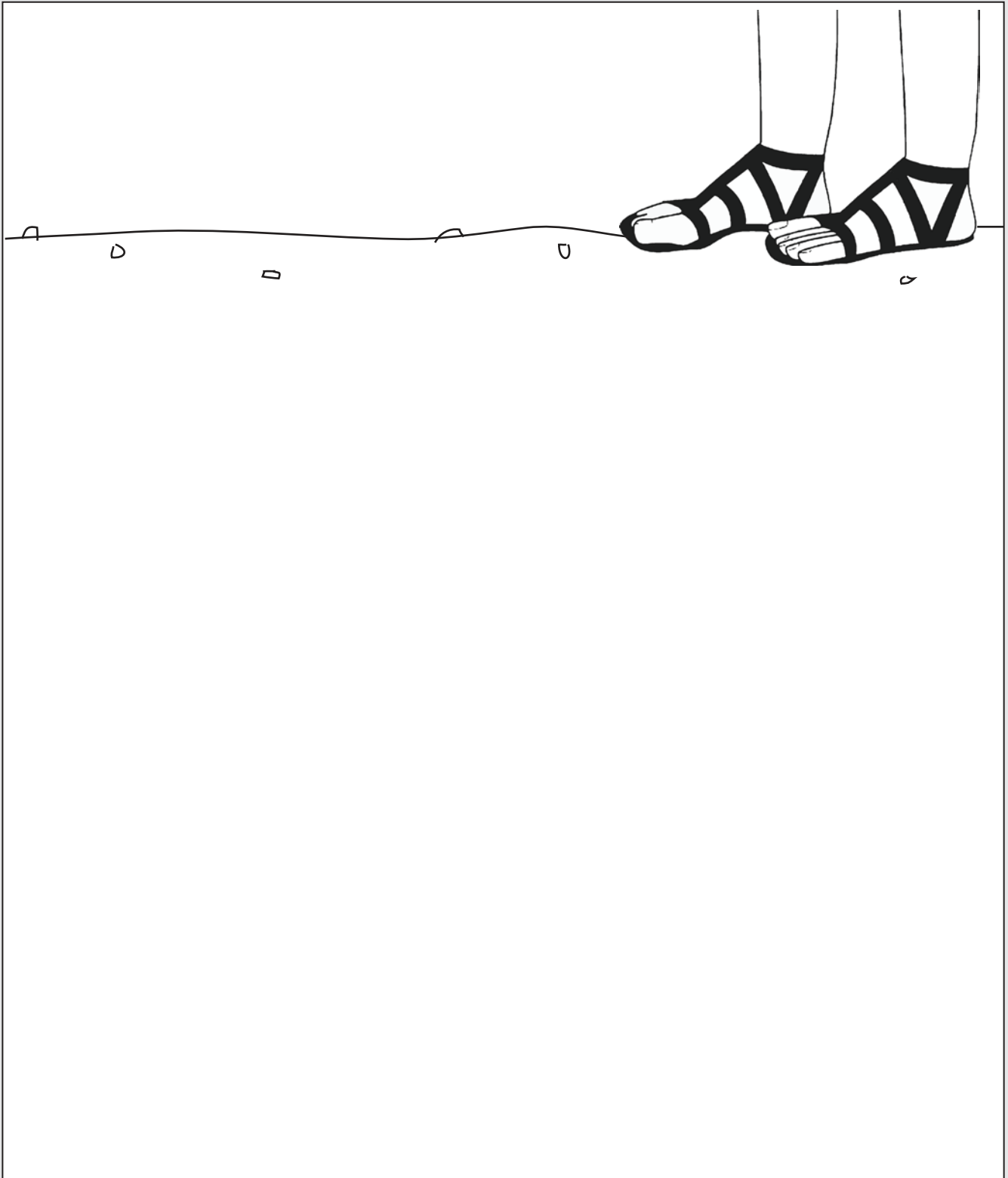

Queen Belqis heard of the attack and went to Prophet Suleiman (AS) to fix the situation between them. She said I surrender to Prophet Suleiman (AS) and his mighty God. She and her people became Muslims.



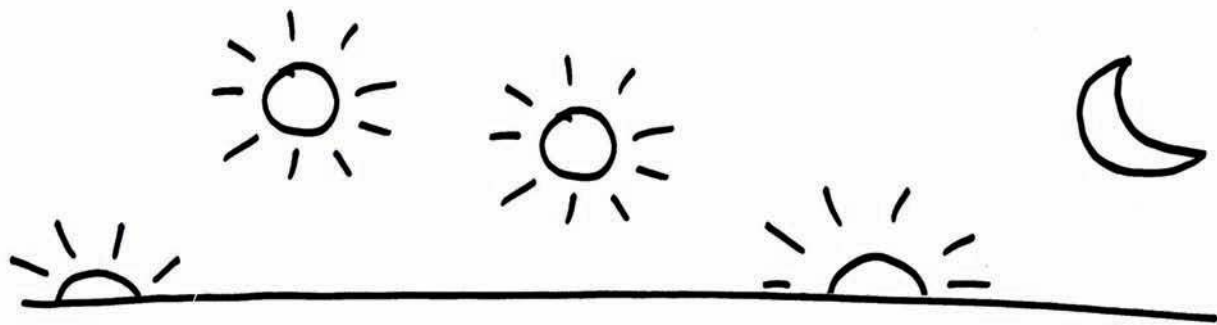

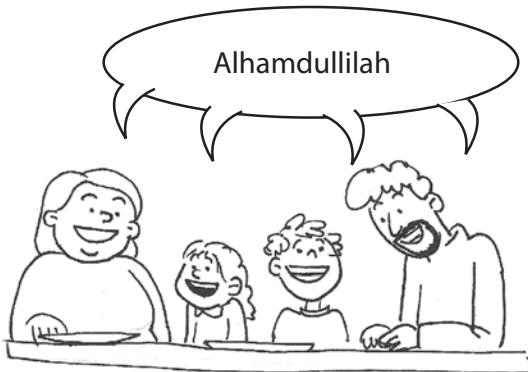
